#### President's Message

#### Happy New Year!

This message is mainly a revision of last month's message. It is important that our decision towards a White Privilege initiative be moved upon. Below is a copy of what I wrote last month. The part in underlined italics has been changed.

We have been struggling for several months with establishing a White Privilege initiative. This has not ignited our Congregation as I thought it might. As we discussed this at the last Board Meeting we concluded that we need to narrow our objective, and concentrate on grasping the concept ourselves before we even think about trying to lead a White Privilege or White Fragility initiative outside the Church.

White Privilege and White Fragility are hard to understand. They are new concepts for all of us. It is hard and uncomfortable to have to confront our own racism and our benefits from being in a racist society. I do not know anyone in our Church who is proud being a racist or from benefiting from the established racist system in which we all live. Yet this is exactly what apparently is the case.

The Board decided to devote the next open, Sunday Morning Church Program to understanding this together. This will not be to plan what to do. We are not ready, and may never be ready, for that. First we need to understand what White Privilege and White Fragility are. These are new concepts for all of us. It will be difficult and painful. We need to do this together so that we can support each other. The date will be Sunday, January 5. There will be no outside speaker. We will share with each other what we have learned and how we feel. Each of us needs to prepare to listen and to share. The more each person finds out about White Privilege and White Fragility before January 5, the better. We now have lots of information to read or watch on videos shown on a page of our our website:
