As summer is clearly upon us we need to organize our summer Sunday Morning Programs. 

Within us you dance



Historic Terrapin Tower Celebration to be held June 6th.

The unveiling of a draft interpretive sign about the Terrapin Tower that stood at the brink of the Horseshoe

Falls from 1833-1873, will be held on Monday, June 6, 2016 at 10:30 a.m. at Terrapin Point on Goat Island.

This sign was created by Lewis Buttery founder of the BRI-NK Foundation and Museum. The BRI-NK

Foundation is hosting this event and is co-sponsored by the Niagara Falls Historic Preservation Society.

Speaking at the event will be Congressman Brian Higgins, a representative for Assemblyman John Cerreto,

Mayor Paul Dyster, Niagara Falls City Historian Elaine Timm and Western District Director of New York State

Parks Mark Thomas.

The event is part of a three day celebration marking the arrival of Robert Nichols, an important figure in the

history of the Niagara region, by his descendants on the 200th Anniversary of his arrival to Niagara County in

1816.

Nichols, a stone mason, was best known for building the famous Terrapin Tower, the stone landmark at the

brink of the Horseshoe Falls which stood from 1833-1873. He was also building the Lewiston 1st Presbyterian

Church when he died on 1834.

Robert was one of ten children of William and Keziah (Fitts) Nichols. On September 1st 1796 he wed Esther

Pierce, sister of Gad Pierce, who owned the Gad Pierce Tavern on the site of today's main branch of the

Niagara Falls Library and after whom Pierce Avenue is named. Nichols brought his family here in 1816 and

stayed with the Pierce family until he purchased property in Lewiston. Robert's funeral was held in the

uncompleted church and is buried in Oakwood Cemetery on Portage Road in Niagara Falls.

His children were Esther Nichols Williams, who moved to Wisconsin, then Illinois, where she is buried; Gad

Pierce Nichols who is buried at the Lewiston 1sr Presbyterian Church and Priscilla Nichols Buttery who is

buried at Oakwood Cemetery along with her husband, parents Robert and Esther and Uncle Gad Pierce.
