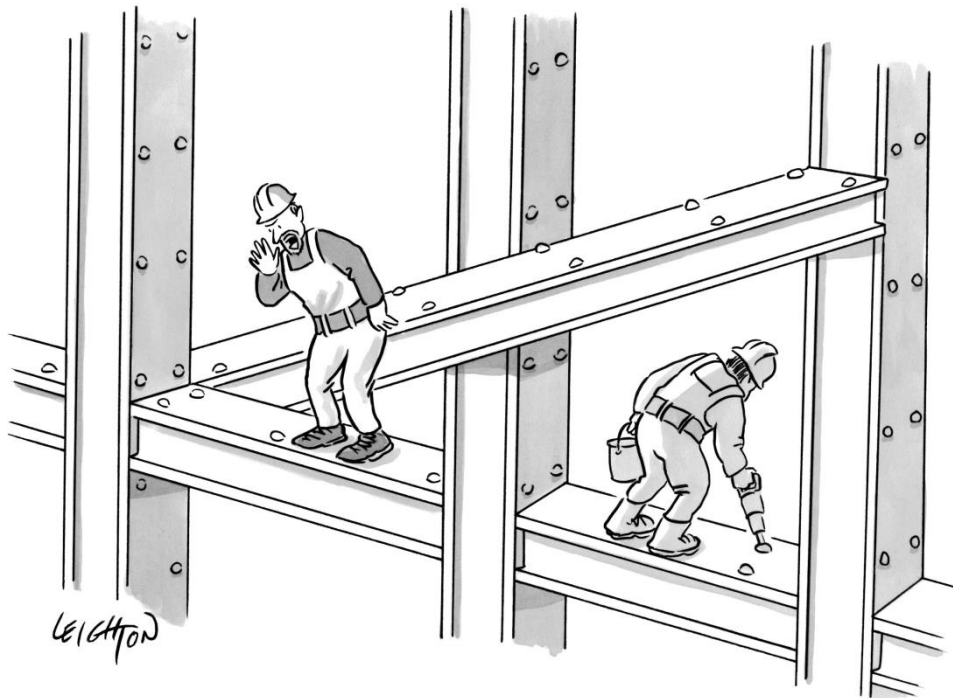
April 30 “The Spiritual Guidance of our Animal Companions,”

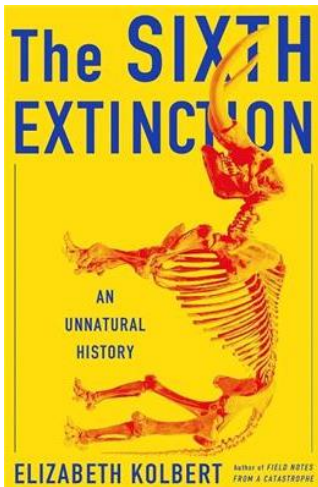
Health Fair
