Minister's Message

It's hard to see the work of winter. It looks only like a time of dormancy, death, Snow!!! Sometimes destruction with wind and ice. Many would avoid its presence all together....and some embrace it for all its worth (such are UU's) but it is exactly what the work of winter creates that we rejoice in come spring. The **Season Cycle** is a primal fact of human life, and of all life on Earth. The seasons exist because the Earth's tilt on her axis and how that interacts with the orbit of Earth around the Sun. So this tilt, this off centered balance creates response to its movement.

Of course there is no response without a planting..a seed, an idea, a desire, a kernal of knowledge or history... Sometimes the planting is purposeful. Sometimes unintended and sometimes, an accident of opportunity. Birds eat plants and as they drop their feces with seeds from their meal, they sow. A scientist experiments with a hyposis and basks in wonder at its outcome. Chocolate fell into cookie batter and made our famous snack and Michael Cervantes planted the idea that there is one god and not a trinity, thus launching a faith movement.

Seeds....

And the work of those seeds is visible ..today..

The lilies are poking up. Babies are being paraded in strollers. Graduates are getting ready to take a scholars walk. All new forms of life and existence are rising forth from the place where they have been quietly waiting to make their presence known. Rising from beneath that which would present as the base/the ground/ the surface of established common standard. There is a magic, giddiness, wonder in the air.It is the tilt..the being off center that moves change and progress..drawing from a place of seeming sleep or void to produce life and sustenance. It is not easy to rise from below. It takes patience, stretching, roots, even nutrients from the very ground from which one wants to ascend. And moving with that flow of tilt discomfort to dance with the seasons of change is part of the great wondering and mystery of creation.

Spring has us celebrating birth..of vegetation, children, intellectuals, unions, and this year, as UU's we are in a place of movement towards change in a long dark underexplored history of our faith. This is not unlike how we came to be...a rising of belief from a revolt, a protest of established norms of faith. It was first the rising of belief against the trinity and continued in beliefs about salvation that poked from below the established norms of its time. Our history is a rising from deep beneath the established norms to stand like that spring flower and bask in the sun's nurturing and to be loved and respected. But with a burgeoning flower, there is always a lot of manure to be dealt with. We have learned through time that history

can be convenient, relevant to who was writing and what other purposes were achieved by any stories unveiling. Sometimes a lot of manure is present in a flower's growth process. We must honor the manure as much as we honor the flower..it is all a part of what helped it to rise from beneath. This equation works for all rising. Few people like the smell or feel of manure, it is unpleasant at best. but the by- product of one cycle is important to the nurturing of another. And so, be it troubling politics, social justice, education,all have got there by the manure that helped feed the rise from beneath.

We are at an interesting place in our faith's movement where rising from below are questions, concerns and challenges to established ways. This is as exciting to some as it is discomforting to others.

None of these challenges or questions change what UUism is....that is an important piece to own.

But how we act, live and interact as UUs has room to rise from beneath established norms and transform into a more inclusive, more representative and more welcoming practice of faith. Transformation is messy, sometimes painful, always looking different at the end than it did in its beginning..but always, always..when done with love and honesty..transformation is beautiful.

To rise from beneath takes the first question...why move? Why be uncomfortable? Why rise? To what end will doing so create? Do I have what it takes to poke through the layers to surface?

Questions and wonder. What questions or wonder do you hold that are part of your movement, growth, transformation??

I can not predict the future. Good things are coming. New leadership in a new form is guiding our UUA these days. GA in June will no doubt be full of fun, surprises, challenge, manure and pain. But together, as UUs, we are going to explore our wonderings and together we are going to rise from beneath our tedium, dullness, complacency and parade a new presence in faith and practice of our very own. This I believe. It is the very foundation on which our faith is built. It is the very spirit in which we walk.


